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Telangana CM demands end to ‘police brutality’ on protesting students

Hyderabad, July 20

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has extended his support to students protesting against the NEET-UG 2026 paper leak in New Delhi. Condemning the reported police lathi-charge and use of tear gas during the "Chalo Sansad" march, Reddy demanded accountability and justice for the country's medical aspirants.

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy backed the students protesting in Delhi and demanded an immediate end to 'police brutality' and accountability in the NEET and other paper leaks scandal.

The Chief Minister posted on social media that students from across India who converged to demand justice over the NEET paper-leak scandal are being beaten up with lathis and tear gas when they were marching to Parliament to draw attention to their struggle.

"The central government is using police force to silence the very youth whose future it has endangered. Every blow struck against a protesting student exposes the BJP's fear of questions, truth and democratic dissent," he said.

"I firmly stand with India's students, and we demand an immediate end to police brutality and accountability in the NEET and other paper leaks scandal," he added.

Reacting to the cancellation of NEET-UG 2026 following the paper leak in May, Revanth Reddy said the credibility of national-level examinations must be protected and that those involved in the paper leak must face punishment.

He stated that the cancellation of the NEET-UG 2026 examination has caused enormous distress and



uncertainty among lakhs of students and parents across India.

"The credibility of national examinations must be protected at all costs. Any individuals or networks involved in paper leaks or corruption must face the strictest punishment, irrespective of their influence or position," he had said.

According to reports from the national capital, the security forces used tear gas shells to disperse thousands of supporters of the Cockroach Janata Party (CJP) who gathered to march to the Parliament on the first day of the monsoon session on Monday, despite police denying permission for the protest.

The police reportedly also used sticks and batons to disperse the crowd, mostly youngsters, who had converged at the Jantar Mantar protest site for the "Chalo Sansad" march against alleged irregularities in NEET and to demand the resignation of Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan.

Some protesters and police personnel sustained minor injuries as they allegedly tried to breach barricades while marching towards Parliament.

Telangana Irrigation Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy on Monday, July 20, said the scientific tests for the repair of the three barrages of the Kaleshwaram project are in the final stages and that designs are being prepared for their revival.

Reddy, who held a meeting with MLAs and other leaders of Nalgonda and other districts, said the government has adopted a scientific approach to resume the Medigadda, Annaram and Sundilla barrages of the Kaleshwaram lift irrigation project.

Kaleshwaram is a multi-purpose project on the Godavari river in the Bhupalpally district. Damage to the barrages of the project, built during the previous BRS regime, was a major issue during the 2023 Assembly election.

Reddy made it clear that the government would not use the three barrages until the experts certify their safety

Leading technical institutions, including Central Water and Power Research Station (CWPRS) and National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI), have conducted tests with regard to the nature of the soil, foundations and concrete structures as part of repairs of the three barrages, he said.

Reddy said the test results have been sent to IIT, Mumbai, where experts are preparing comprehensive designs for their revival.



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He made it clear that the state government would take up the revival of the barrages as per the instructions of the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA), the Central Water Commission (CWC) and also a technical supervisory committee appointed by the Centre.

Roach rage rattles Delhi;

cops resort to lathicharge, tear gas during CJP march to Parliament; 50 injured

New Delhi, July 20

Thousands gathered in support of the Cockroach Janta Party (CJP)-led march on Parliament on Monday, defying a Delhi Police crackdown that saw the deployment of batons and tear gas shells to disperse crowds that repeatedly regrouped.

Both police personnel and protesters were injured in clashes through the day, with over 100 people detained as the police struggled to maintain order in central Delhi.

The protest, reminiscent of the 2019 anti-CAA agitation, saw the government engage CJP leaders for the first time in a month since they began their sit-in on June 20, demanding the resignation of Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan over the NEET-UG 2026 paper leak.

Union Minister JP Nadda met CJP's Saurav Das and Ashutosh Ranka, who presented their demands, including Pradhan's ouster. While the government asked the protesters to end their sit-in as it considered the CJP memorandum, activist Sonam Wangchuk announced that he would continue his fast until youth leaders were allowed to meet MPs in Parliament or MPs were allowed to meet him at the hospital where he is undergoing treatment.

Wangchuk's hunger strike entered its 23rd day on Monday, even as CJP founder Abhijeet Dipke ended his fast.

The day saw groups of protesters repeatedly trying to breach barricades to reach Parliament, while the police virtually sealed every approach to the high-security zone.

Multi-layered barricades and heavy deployment of security personnel locked down Jantar Mantar and surrounding roads, including Connaught Place, Janpath, Parliament Street and Raisina Road, leaving

demonstrators hemmed in with little room to move forward or disperse.

As crowds swelled, security personnel launched successive lathi charges to push protesters back, while tear gas shells were fired at several locations.

On the ground, The Tribune correspondent witnessed prolonged face-offs between Delhi Police, Rapid Action Force (RAF) personnel and protesters, leading to stampede-like situations at multiple locations, with protesters breaking barricades and security forces pushing them back.

This correspondent also witnessed isolated instances of violence directed at police personnel, with a section of protesters attacking officials during clashes. The police sources claimed some people in the crowd threw stones, forcing them to resort to lathi charge and tear gas shelling.

In one incident near Regal Cinema, a protester was seen throwing stones at the police. When asked why he was resorting to violence, he said, "They brutally hit my friend. They are hitting us wherever they find us. Now if they hit us, we will hit back."

Though such incidents were isolated, they underscored the tension that gripped the capital throughout the day, with nearly 9,000 security personnel, including paramilitary forces, deployed to control the surging crowds.

By evening, the CJP protest stage at Jantar Mantar had been dismantled, even as protesters regrouped near the site. At several locations, this correspondent spotted people in casual clothing chasing away protesters and assaulting them. At another location, a group of protesters was seen assaulting a police official.

Parliament gates and several office buildings



remained out of bounds for long periods as the Home Ministry ordered suspension of Internet services in two phases -- from 8 am to noon and from noon to 6 pm. The temporary suspension was ordered by the MHA under the Telecommunications Act, 2023.

The police said the Internet clampdown was necessary to prevent the spread of misinformation on social media, with several posts under investigation.

As panic spread across the city, the police repeatedly took to X to dispel what it described as rumours.

The police said force was used only after repeated attempts by protesters to violate prohibitory orders under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), which bars unlawful assemblies except at designated protest sites with prior permission.

No Parliament biz on Day 1 as Opposition raises paper leak, donation theft

New Delhi, July 20

The first day of the monsoon session of Parliament got washed out amid stormy protests in both Houses by the Opposition over the NEET paper leak and the Ram Temple donation theft controversy.

After a dozen adjournments — six times each

in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha — both Houses were adjourned for the day. While protests by students spiralled out of control outside the Parliament House complex as thousands of them converged on Jantar Mantar amid heavy police and paramilitary presence, inside Parliament, both Houses could not transact any

business and were adjourned for the day at 3 pm. The severity of the protests outside by students could be gauged from the fact that the Parliament complex's gates were locked from inside for several hours, making it difficult for staffers and other personnel to either enter or depart from there.

Delhi's e-rickshaw battery scare: What changed for drivers in two weeks

For the past two weeks, every time 45-year-old e-rickshaw driver Peshkar slowed down in traffic, he worried someone had remotely switched off his vehicle. “I took my vehicle to the manufacturing company in Naraina where they said they had installed a code on my battery, so no one will be able to shut it off. I am happy that they did this for free,” said Peshkar, who ferries passengers in his e-rickshaw between Moti Nagar and Inderlok in West Delhi. The reassurance comes after weeks of anxiety among Delhi’s e-rickshaw drivers, whose vehicles had stopped dead in the middle of the road after strangers using Bluetooth-enabled mobile apps connected to their vehicles’ battery management systems (BMS) and remotely switched them off.

Following reports of the misuse, the Centre directed Apple and Google to take down seven mobile applications linked to the batteries, while manufacturers rolled out their own apps. Apart from a few stray incidents, most e-rickshaw drivers who spoke to said they have not experienced any fresh incidents since the apps were blocked, with business returning to normal. Fifty-year-old Ranjeet still recalls the panic when his e-rickshaw suddenly stopped in the middle of the road two weeks ago. "I was ferrying four passengers when my e-rickshaw suddenly stopped at Mundka Mor. I couldn't understand it because my battery was more than half charged," he said. He said he tried to restart, but to no avail. Some fellow e-rickshaw drivers pushed his vehicle to the side of the road. "I couldn't push alone as I am a heart patient," he said. Besides refunding Rs 40 to his passengers, he estimates he had lost a few hundred rupees more while searching for a mechanic. The vehicle stopped around 5 pm and did not restart until 10 pm, wiping out his peak earning hours. The next day, his vehicle stopped again at the Mundka Metro station around 11 pm. "This time, some kind strangers helped me in pushing it to the nearest mechanic. He said he has locked my battery. Since then, my vehicle has not stopped," Ranjeet said. Rajiv Tuli, General Secretary of Electric Vehicle Manufacturing So-



ciety (EVMS), said manufacturing companies set up helplines that stranded drivers could call and get assistance on how to restart their vehicle. "They have also made their own apps now which drivers can use," he said.

What caused the issue? The apps that had been directed to be blocked include BAT-BMS, Lossigy, Epoch Li-ion, and Smart BMS, among others. At least a couple of them are of Chinese origin. The BAT-BMS app was originally developed by China's Shenzhen Grenergy Technology as a legitimate battery management tool for Bluetooth-enabled lithium-ion batteries. The app allows users to monitor a battery's state of charge, voltage, current, temperature, charging cycles, and overall health. Such apps are typically designed to be used at service centres for battery-related diagnostics. The problem emerged because several low-cost lithium-ion batteries used in e-rickshaws were fitted with Chinese-made battery management systems that lacked adequate password protection or continued to use default credentials, allowing anyone nearby to connect via Bluetooth and remotely switch off the battery. Not all e-rickshaws were susceptible to these attacks. Many e-rickshaws continue to run on lead-acid batteries, while several lithium-powered vehicles use proprietary battery management systems that cannot be accessed through applications like BAT-BMS. Jeetu Mehra, a 30-year-old who drives an e-rickshaw at Central Delhi's Karol Bagh, is among the very few who said their vehicle stalled recently. "On Saturday, the moment passengers sat in my rickshaw at Jata Mandi, it stopped. But I was not scared this time," he said.

Fresh violence on Mumbai local: Two injured in late-night fight aboard local train

Two individuals were injured in a fresh violence onboard a Mumbai local train, raising serious questions over lack of security and passenger safety. The incident was reported around 12:30 am in the early hours of Wednesday, July 15, inside the luggage coach of Ambarnath-bound Mumbai local, barely a month after a fatal stabbing incident inside one of the suburban trains. According to railway officials, the two men got into a fight, during which both sustained head injuries.

What led to the fight?

Laxman Chavan, senior inspector of Dombivali GRP, said that Pritesh Kanojia, a Titwala resident, was travelling in the luggage compartment of the train and dozed off. Later, two persons, identified as Raju Waghe and Sahil Khandare, boarded the same compartment and confronted Kanojia and asked him to get up, leading to a scuffle between the two parties. As one of them was wearing a kada, it also hit some other commuters. Due to the fight between the two sides, one of them lost consciousness. Both sides are currently being discharged from the hospital and we are in the process of registering offences against both sides in the matter. No weapons have been used," Chavan said. The train was attended at Kalyan

station by personnel from the Railway Protection Force (RPF) and the Government Railway Police (GRP). Both injured passengers were administered first aid before being shifted to Rukhmabai Hospital. One of them, who suffered a severe head injury, was later referred to Sion Hospital for further treatment.

The senior inspector has said that they are in the process of registering two FIRs – one each on behalf of the two parties.

Dharmasthala 'secret burials': SIT files final report, says allegations false

The Karnataka Police team investigating the alleged “secret burials” in the temple town of Dharmasthala has filed its final report, concluding that the complainant had made false allegations. A report for the completion of the probe was filed in a magistrate’s court in Dakshina Kannada on Wednesday. The report is filed under Section 215 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhitha (BNSS, 2023,” a Special Investigation Team (SIT) source said. The report under this BNSS section indicates that the allegations were found to be false and leaves it to the court to decide whether to initiate perjury proceedings, the source added. The final report filed on Wednesday runs over 7,000 pages and details the SIT’s efforts to ascertain the truth behind former sanitation worker C N Chinnaiah’s claims of secret burials of dozens of bodies in Dharmasthala between 1995 and 2014. Chinnaiah named sole accused

Last year, Chinnaiiah claimed to have carried out dozens of secret burials in the temple town. Based on his allegations, the Dharmasthala police filed a First Information Report (FIR) on July 4 and sought an official statement from him in court. Chinnaiiah appeared before a magistrate's court in Belthangady on July 11, 2025, to provide a statement. On July 19, the Karnataka government constituted an SIT headed by DGP-rank officer Pranab Mohanty. The SIT's search for the bodies for over a month proved futile, following which Chinnaiiah was arrested on August 23, 2025, on charges of providing false information. Months later, in November, the SIT filed an initial report before the Belthangady magistrate's court, saying it had found no evidence to substantiate his claims. Chinnaiiah had produced a skull he claimed was a part of the "secret burials" he had conducted at the temple town. SIT investigations, however, revealed that the skull was given by the uncle of a teenage girl who was raped and murdered in the temple town in 2012. The 2012 murder probe did not stand up to legal scrutiny, and no one was found guilty by the courts. At the conclusion of its probe, the SIT has named Chinnaiiah as the sole accused, charged with providing false information. Investigators have further indicated that several activists from the region—Mahesh Thimaroddy, Jayanth T, and Vittal Gowda—and former police official Girish Mattanavar were part of an alleged misinformation plot. The SIT said Chinnaiiah was part of a conspiracy hatched by

Thimarody, Mattanavar, Jayanth T and Gowda to target the administrators of the Sree Dharmasthala Manjunatheshwara Temple Trust and its 'dharmaadhikari' Veerendra Heggade, a Rajya Sabha MP associated with the BJP.No evidence to back allegationsSeveral aspects of the 'secret burials' investigation that began in July 2025 unravelled on account of the lack of evidence.Chinnaiah, whose identity was initially protected, claimed that he witnessed some murders being committed in a "cruel manner", adding that he was forced to dispose of the bodies. "I have buried hundreds of bodies, and the final rites were not performed respectfully. The guilt is haunting me, and I believe that the final rites should be performed to pave a respectful farewell to the deceased," he said in a letter sent to the police through his advocates ahead of the filing of the case.A two-week search for the remains, however, yielded no major results.The SIT, which began the search for the remains on July 29, 2025, found bones at one of 13 locations indicated by Chinnaiah, police sources said. The remains of a person who allegedly died by suicide were found during a search operation on the banks of the Nethravathi River and the forests surrounding the bathing ghats near Dharmasthala, sources added.An elderly woman, Sujatha Bhat, had filed a complaint stating that her daughter, a medical student at Manipal, went missing in Dharmasthala in 2003.

The local police did not register a First Information Report, and after preliminary investigations, the SIT could not corroborate her statements. In June this year, Chinnaiah, who was released on bail last year, approached the Karnataka High Court over the SIT's delay in filing a chargesheet and prosecuting others in the case. He stated that the SIT has only named him as an accused but has not filed a final report in the case, giving rise to "the doubtful circumstances involved in the matter." Chinnaiah's petition filed on June 8 says the SIT filed a preliminary inquiry report in November 2025 naming five people as conspirators in perpetrating the 'secret burials' claim on social media. "Though they have named aforesaid persons as conspirators, there is no action taken against them. Further, there is no separate crime case registered against them for having played fraud on the court and having caused loss to the state exchequer through the process of law," the writ petition, which is to be heard on July 22, states.

Amritsar Airport dispatches India-UK CETA garment shipment to Birmingham

The first-ever export consignment of ready-made garments under the newly enacted India-UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) was successfully flagged off today from Sri Guru Ram Dass Jee International Airport in Amritsar. The special commercial shipment was dispatched directly to Birmingham, United Kingdom, aboard a scheduled Air India flight. The landmark departure ceremony was attended by a cohort of senior officials, including Aditya Singh Chauhan (Deputy DGFT), Gaurav Gupta (Assistant Director), A K Sharma (Airport Director), Varun (CSO, Airport), Azad Singh (Station In-charge, Cargo, Amritsar) and Rishabh (Import-Export Executive, Amritsar Cargo).

According to PIB, the operationalisation of the India-UK CETA on July 15, 2026, ushers in a transformative era for cross-border commerce between the two nations. One of the provisions of the agreement is the tariff relief granted to Indian goods, ensuring that approximately 99 per cent of all Indian products will get comprehensive duty-free access to the British market. India's labor-intensive textile and garment sector stands out as a primary beneficiary.

Before the enforcement of the CETA framework, steep import duties ranging anywhere from 4 per cent to 16 per cent were levied on Indian ready-made garments exported to the UK. Under the new guidelines, this tariff has been slashed to zero per cent. This agreement effectively lowers production premiums, a change projected to trigger a rapid surge in demand and dramatically expand the market share of Indian apparel across high-street and digital retail spaces in the United Kingdom. This initial shipment represents a massive validation of regional infrastructure and a boost for the local economy in Punjab. By clearing and routing international cargo directly from the Amritsar Cargo Terminal via Air India, regional manufacturers and exporters no longer have to rely on congested logistics hubs in distant metropolitan cities like New Delhi or Mumbai. This logistical independence translates directly into monumental savings in transit time, fuel consumption, and overall supply chain expenses. Consequently, the inaugural flight to Birmingham establishes Amritsar as a vital international trade gateway, enabling local businesses to participate seamlessly in the global economy.

Punjab police resort to lathi-charge, teargas, and water cannons to disperse protesting MGNREGA workers

A protest by MGNREGA employees demanding regularisation of their services and release of eight months' pending salaries turned violent in Khanna on Wednesday when police used lathi-charge, tear gas and water cannons to stop demonstrators marching towards the residence of Punjab Rural Development and Panchayat Minister Tarunpreet Singh Sond. According to protesters, 10 of them suffered injuries in the police action and were admitted to the Khanna Civil Hospital and private hospitals. Police officers, including Khanna DSP Vinod Kumar, also sustained injuries during the clash.

The employees, who had gathered at Prem Bhandari Park in the morning, marched towards the minister's residence on Amloh Road to submit a memorandum seeking the regularisation of over 2,000 contractual MGNREGA staff by merging them into the Department of Rural Development and Panchayats and the release of salaries pending for the last eight months. Police had erected barricades near the minister's residence. As protesters attempted to move past them, police resorted to lathi-charge, fired tear gas shells and used water cannons to disperse the crowd. Police said force was used after protesters tried to breach the barricades and advance towards the minister's residence. Additional personnel were deployed and the situation was later brought under control. The Pendu Mazdoor Union, which extended support to the protest, condemned the police action. State president Tarsem Peter alleged that protesters were peacefully proceeding to submit their memorandum when they were stopped and assaulted. He claimed several women protesters were injured and alleged that police manhandled them during the clash. The union said Fatehgarh Sahib resident Sudagar Singh suffered fractures in both legs and was referred to a hospital in Mohali due to the seriousness of his injuries. Tarsem Peter demanded that the Punjab government provide free medical treatment and compensation to all injured workers. In a separate incident after the protest, a canter carrying MGNREGA workers back to their villages overturned following a head-on collision with another vehicle near Bijai village. One worker, identified as Sukhdev Singh, was killed, while several others were injured and admitted to nearby hospitals. The police action triggered sharp political reactions.

Punjab Congress president Amarinder Singh Raja Warring condemned the use of force against the protesting workers, alleging that the Bhagwant Mann government had "turned Punjab into a police state". He said the MGNREGA workers were holding a peaceful 'dharna'.

and chanting 'Satnam Wahe Guru' (Sikh religious chant), yet the police resorted to "brutality". He questioned the use of water cannons, teargas shells, and lathi-charge against protesting MGNREGA workers. "Is this how common man's government deals with its people?" Warring demanded suspension of police and administrative officers who resorted to "unprovoked" lathi-charge on MGNREGA workers. Shiromani Akali Dal president Sukhbir Singh Badal also criticised the crackdown, alleging that contractual employees seeking their legitimate dues were met with "lathi, water cannons and tear gas". "These contractual employees and labourers were only demanding their rightful pending wages... This is not governance, this is pure dictatorship and 'Danda Tantra'! You cannot silence the voice of the people with brute force," he said. Leader of Opposition Partap Singh Bajwa said the government should immediately clear pending MGNREGA dues and address the workers' grievances through dialogue instead of force.

More trouble for Siya Goyal's family, food safety watchdog halts business

Trouble has mounted for the family of 20-year-old Siya Goyal, who is accused of murdering her 25-year-old fiancée, Ketan Agarwal. Following an inspection, the Maharashtra Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has asked Siya's family-owned grocery business to halt operations for allegedly violating norms of the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India. The family-owned business deals in spices and dry fruits.

The inspection on the company's premises at Pune's Gultekdi was carried out following a tip-off. "During the inspection, authorities seized 84 food samples, including turmeric powder, oil, and soybean chunks, weighing a total of 4,172 kg and valued at Rs 8.13 lakh," said DV Bhogawade, Joint Commissioner of FDA, adding that the action was carried out as part of Safe Food, Safe Drug, Safe Maharashtra campaign.



Pune man held for distributing ‘rat poison capsules’ at Mumbai Muharram rally

Faiyaz Premji Mumbai poison capsuleAccording to the Mumbai police, Faiyaz Premji is a BBA graduate. His father owns a paint company in Pune. and his mother and sister are in Iran.A 39-year-old man from Pune was arrested on Saturday for allegedly distributing capsules mixed with zinc phosphide—rat poison—during a Muharram procession in south Mumbai on Friday night.The police identified the accused as Faiyaz Premji and said that he had 14,000 capsules with him. He allegedly told the police that he intended to harm those who had gathered for the religious event. Officers are now interrogating him to determine his motive.Zinc phosphide, a rodenticide, is commonly used to kill rats and is also used as a single-dose poison in agricultural fields.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Jayant Meena said the case came to light after employees of a

hospital reported that a man had been admitted with vomiting and severe stomach cramps after consuming a “pain-killer” tablet that was allegedly being handed out during the procession. Suspecting something amiss, the doctors alerted the police, who picked up Premji.“He told us he wanted to target the procession and harm them. He had ordered 30,000 capsules online and 50 kg of zinc phosphide. He added 1 gram of zinc phosphide to each capsule,” DCP Meena said. He added that Premji claimed the capsules were painkillers while distributing them among participants.According to the police, Premji is a BBA graduate whose father owns a paint company in Pune. His mother and sister are in Iran and he himself had visited Iran and Iraq in 2025.DCP Meena added that by acting swiftly, the police had averted a major tragedy. An officer said they are checking how many people took the pills and if anyone else has complained of any health issues.

Punjab man dies in Italy police custody after sexual assault complaint

The death of a 23-year-old Punjabi man in police custody in Italy on June 23 has left his family in Punjab's Hoshiarpur devastated and searching for answers, with Italian authorities ordering an investigation into the circumstances surrounding the incident.The deceased, Sukhwinder Singh alias Sonu, a resident of Miani village, was arrested by the Italian Police on June 21 following a complaint by three minor girls who allegedly accused him of inappropriate behaviour during a visit to Tibidabo Water Park.

The man had been living in Italy for the past five years. He worked as an agricultural labourer near Brescia and was reportedly in the process of regularising his stay in the country.What made the tragedy even more painful for the family was the manner in which they learned about his death. The family received an official communication in Italian, a language neither the family nor many educated residents of the village could understand. It was only after a local youth used an Artificial Intelligence-based translation tool to convert the document into Punjabi that the family came to know that Sukhwinder had died. The translated communication stated that Sukhwinder had died while in custody.Italian authorities stated that after Sukhwinder's arrest, the matter was subsequently placed before a court, which recorded the statements of the minor girls.Based on those statements, the court reportedly held him responsible for sexual harassment-related allegations and ordered that he be sent to jail.Officials further informed the family that Sukhwinder had no previous criminal record in Italy. He had also applied for political asylum and was awaiting the outcome of his immigration-related proceedings.Family maintains Sukhwinder was innocentThe family, however, has strongly disputed the allegations.

Sukhwinder's younger sister, Amandeep Kaur, said her brother had spoken to the family shortly before his arrest and narrated a different version of events.According to her, Sukhwinder told them that while passing through the water park, where three girls were taking selfies and chatting, his hand accidentally brushed against one of them. However, the exact cause of death has not yet been officially established.Investigation and post-mortem orderedFollowing the custodial death, senior Italian police officials have initiated an investigation into the case.According to information shared with the family, the Brescia Prosecutor's Office has ordered a post-mortem examination of the body. A special inquiry committee has also been constituted to examine the circumstances leading to the death and determine whether any lapses occurred during his detention.Authorities are expected to rely on forensic findings, prison records, and other evidence to establish the exact cause of death.For Sukhwinder's family, the tragedy has brought an abrupt end to years of sacrifice and hope.He had moved to Italy around five years ago after studying up to Class 11, hoping to improve the family's financial condition. His mother had reportedly mortgaged her jewellery and taken loans worth nearly ₹15 lakh to finance his journey abroad. She died two years ago. Sukhwinder could not attend her last rites because of his immigration situation.The family says he was their only son and the main hope for improving their economic circumstances.Relatives describe him as a religious-minded young man who had served as a pathi (a religious man at the Gurudwara who recites religious texts) at the village gurdwara before leaving for Italy.

Video row escalates, SGPC asks Bhagwant Mann to resign over ‘grave mistake’

The general house of the Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) on Saturday passed a resolution demanding the immediate resignation of Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann over a viral video and directed that a First Information Report (FIR) be filed against him."This is a grave mistake by the chief minister, one that is unforgivable. Bhagwant Singh Mann has lost the moral right to remain in office and must resign immediately," the SGPC declared.

Reading the resolution, SGPC president Harjinder Singh Dhami said that the purported video of Mann has "caused massive outrage and anger across the entire Sikh world." Akal Takht Jathedar Giani Kuldeep Singh Gargaji was also present at the meeting.Mann has been under fire from the Akal Takht, the highest temporal body of Sikhs, which has alleged that the person in the video is him and declared him "Guru dokhi" (anti-Guru) and "panth virodhi" (anti-panth). Mann has denied the allegation.'Mann used lies, influence'The SGPC general house endorsed the action taken by the Akal Takht in issuing notice over the matter, calling it "an important step in keeping with national traditions".The SGPC general house also took serious note of what it described as a confrontational policy adopted by Mann toward the Akal Takht. It alleged, "In order to defend himself, the chief

minister used lies, government officials, and official influence to get a fake report prepared from a laboratory in Gurgaon—the truth of which has now come before the Sangat."The resolution noted that Jaspreet Singh, associated with the laboratory in question, has issued a statement to the media, and that Haryana Police has registered an FIR in the matter.

The SGPC general house directed its executive committee to meet the Punjab director general of police and formally seek registration of criminal cases against Mann and his associates on charges including misuse of a constitutional office, use of government resources to fabricate false evidence, suppression of genuine evidence, and hurting religious sentiments and committing sacrilege.It also announced that it will launch a large-scale campaign across every constituency to mobilise the Sikh community in line with the Akal Takht directives. Preachers will be deployed across Punjab to "firmly uphold the Akal Takht's orders against Mann and inspire the Sangat to stand firm", it added.The SGPC general house also appealed to the Khalsa Panth, Sikh institutions, gurdwara management committees, religious organisations, and Panth-loving individuals to "oppose Bhagwant Singh Mann at every level to protect Gur Maryada under the guidance and orders of Akal Takht Sahib."

Pune civic body plans new water tanker rules to fix complaints

The city's ongoing water crisis took centre stage at a Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) standing committee meeting on Friday, as chairman Shrinath Bhimale ordered the formulation of a comprehensive Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) to govern tanker-based water supply.The directive comes nearly two weeks after PMC introduced an alternate-day water supply on June 15, a measure that invited a flood of complaints, with over 1,200 grievances logged so far. Of these, 450 have been resolved, while roughly 750 remain pending.Addressing a press conference, Bhimale outlined the scale of the problem. "We are facing numerous issues – water being sold at inflated rates, delayed tanker arrivals, the deficiency of GPS systems, road accidents, complaints regarding water quality, and a lack of regulation," he said.

He stressed the need to consider all these factors and establish a uniform, effective SOP.With several areas of the city receiving water on alternate days and others dependent almost entirely on tanker supply, the committee's discussion covered a wide spectrum, from overcharging by private operators to the exploitation of vulnerable residents during peak scarcity.As an immediate step, the PMC administration has been directed to place before the standing committee a detailed status report on tanker operations in the city. This includes the total number of PMC and private tankers currently in service, the capacity of tanker-filling stations, authorised rates, accident data, driver credentials, GPS deployment, online booking mechanisms, water quality testing protocols, and information about the control room setup.The

proposed SOP addresses both citizen convenience and operational accountability. On the transparency front, the guidelines call for an official rate card to be announced and displayed on every tanker, an online and helpline-based booking system, a mobile application for citizens to track tankers in real time, and strict enforcement of a first-come, first-served supply policy.

Road safety has emerged as a parallel concern. The committee has directed that speed limits be imposed on tankers, with stricter norms applicable near schools and hospitals. Tanker drivers will be required to undergo regular training, periodic medical check-ups, and mandatory testing for alcohol and narcotics. All vehicles must be fitted with safety lights, reverse cameras, and alarm systems, while hazardous locations and accident-prone stretches are to be identified and flagged.On the quality front, Bhimale announced that every tanker will be required to carry water that has been regularly sampled and chlorinated. Strict action has been mandated against suppliers found distributing contaminated water. Additionally, all private tankers will need to be registered with the PMC, obtain annual fitness certification, and be placed on a publicly accessible list – with a separate registry maintained for rule violators.The committee has also directed the administration to ensure priority tanker supply to hospitals, schools, police stations, and fire stations. A dedicated action plan is to be drawn up for water-scarce zones, and a 24/7 helpline is to be launched for the immediate redressal of tanker-related complaints, with a 24-hour resolution window mandated for each grievance received.

Punjab reverses stand, to roll out VB-G RAM G scheme from July

The Punjab government has notified the implementation of the Centre's Viksit Bharat-Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (Gramin) (VB-G RAM G) scheme from July 1, in a complete reversal of the stand it had taken barely six months ago when the Punjab Assembly had unanimously passed a resolution rejecting the legislation.A notification issued by the Punjab Rural Development and Panchayats Department on Friday states that the provisions of the VB-G RAM G Act, 2025 will come into force in the state from July 1. The implementation follows the Centre's rollout of the new rural employment law, which replaces the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA).The move marks a sharp U-turn by the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government. On December 30, 2025, the Punjab government had convened a special Assembly session and got a unanimous resolution passed rejecting the VB-G RAM G Act. The House urged the Centre to withdraw the law and restore MGNREGA in its original rights-based form.The resolution stated that the new law takes away the legal guarantee of employment and timely wages available to poor labourers, women and lakhs of job card holders. It said the legislation converts MGNREGA from

a demand-driven, rights-based programme into a norm-based scheme, imposes an additional financial burden on states by changing the funding pattern, and weakens the federal structure by reducing the Centre's responsibility.Replying to the debate in the Assembly, Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann had described the legislation as anti-poor, anti-Dalit, anti-farmer, anti-labourer and anti-women. He had argued that it would deprive rural workers of their guaranteed right to employment and wages and maintained that Punjab would not implement the law.'What is the deal with the BJP'The notification has triggered sharp political reactions, with the Congress accusing the government of contradicting its own position.Punjab Congress president Amarinder Singh Raja Warring questioned why the government had implemented the scheme after rejecting it in the Assembly. "What is the deal with the BJP?" he asked.Warring pointed out that the Punjab government had negated its own resolution by notifying its implementation. He said the timing of the notification was equally surprising and asked whether it had anything to do with the ongoing controversy surrounding Mann.

Mallikarjun Kharge writes to PM Modi, seeks all-party meet on revised delimitation bill

New Delhi: Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge on Thursday wrote to Prime Minister Narendra Modi over reports that the government is now planning to reintroduce a Constitution amendment bill that would involve delimitation, urging him to convene an all-party meeting to discuss the revised proposals.In his letter to the PM, Kharge said during March and April, he had been writing to Minister of Parliamentary Affairs Kiren Rijiju, requesting that the Union government convene an all-party meeting to discuss its proposals regarding delimitation, etc."Unfortunately, these requests had not been accepted. The Constitution (131st Amendment) Bill, 2026, then failed to secure the required 2/3 majority in Lok Sabha on 17 April, 2026 by a clear margin," he said.

"I have been reading in media reports that the Union Government now proposes to reintroduce a revised (131st Amendment) Bill, 2026 during the forthcoming Monsoon Session of Parliament. I would, once again, request you to convene an all-party meeting to discuss the government's revised proposals on delimitation, etc., and give us adequate time to study them in detail before they are introduced in Parliament," Kharge said.The Congress chief's letter comes days after it emerged that the government is learnt to be working on multiple formulations to increase the number of Lok Sabha seats for all states by 50 per cent to assuage the concerns of southern states, as it seeks to operationalise a fresh draft of the Constitution amendment bill on women's quota law.The draft is being readied keeping in mind the concerns of the southern states that a population-based delimitation exercise would shrink their political power in the Lok Sabha.The



first Bill failed to clear the Lok Sabha test on April 17, as the government could not muster the two-thirds majority required to pass it.The Modi government had said that it wanted to get the Bill passed as it wanted to advance the enforcement of the women reservation law.As of now, the ruling NDA has around 300 MPs in the Lok Sabha with three vacancies. It needs 360 votes to achieve the two-thirds mark.Under the current law, reservation for women would not be enforceable before 2034, as the process is tied to the completion of the delimitation exercise post the 2027 Census.

India-UK FTA opens new opportunities

As the historic free trade agreement with the United Kingdom comes into effect, culminating years of tough negotiations, a slew of opportunities beckons Indian exporters across key sectors. The Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) is a win-win proposition for both countries and would go a long way in deepening economic engagement and creating new opportunities for businesses, workers and investors. The most significant outcome is that the agreement will provide zero-duty market access for nearly 99% of India's exports, covering sectors like textiles, leather, gems and jewellery, engineering goods, marine products, chemicals and processed foods. Additionally, the social security agreement will provide support to Indian professionals working temporarily in the UK and strengthen the competitiveness of Indian enterprises. Indian professionals on temporary assignments will be exempt from double social security contributions for up to five years, enhancing the global competitiveness of our workforce. This provision is projected to benefit over 75,000 professionals and 900 companies across IT, financial, healthcare, education, telecommunication, and consultancy sectors. This is truly a significant moment for India, as its farmers, entrepreneurs and MSMEs will stand to gain. The free trade agreement was signed in London last year in the presence of visiting Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his British counterpart Keir Starmer. It is expected to boost bilateral trade between the two economies by \$34 billion annually and open new avenues for India's IT, financial, education, professional and business services sectors. For the agricultural sector, the agreement provides zero-duty access to all products, with specific exclusions for chicken, pork, eggs, rice, and sugar. It also grants duty-free access to 97.1% of tariff lines for processed food products, offering Indian exporters an immediate edge in the UK's agricultural import market, which exceeds \$90 billion. Gems and jewellery exporters expect shipments to the UK to grow by 230% to \$2.5 billion within the next three years, while exporters of engineering goods expect sales to almost double to \$7.5 billion over the next four to five years. At the same time, the agreement safeguards sensitive farm products such as dairy, vegetables, apples, edible oils, oats, millets, cooking oils and others by placing them on the sensitive list, and no duty concessions have been granted to the UK on these items. Enhanced market access and regulatory certainty will support Indian service providers in IT and IT-enabled services, financial and professional services, healthcare, education, engineering, telecom and consultancy services. The foundation for the agreement was laid through the India-UK Enhanced Trade Partnership and the Roadmap 2030, launched in May 2021, which set an ambitious target of doubling bilateral trade to \$100 billion by 2030. Following 14 rounds of negotiations, the agreement, comprising 30 chapters, was concluded on May 6 last year and signed in London two months later.

Excess fee charged by School of Eminence: Minister Bains assures action

Punjab Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains on Wednesday assured action against those responsible for the alleged collection of unauthorised fees at the School of Eminence (SoE) in Nawanshahr after the issue was raised during his visit to Raja Sahib Da Mazara near Banga. The controversy first came to light in April after parents alleged that students seeking admission to Class XI were asked to pay around Rs 5,000 despite the notified annual fee for government schools being about Rs 876. Several parents claimed they paid the amount fearing their children would lose admission. The matter was flagged by AAP's district in-charge for the Nasha Mukti Morcha, Dinesh Suri, MLA Dr SK Sukhi and mediapersons. During the interaction, Bains reportedly said the school's principal should be suspended. Sukhi, however, reminded the minister that he had raised the issue in the Assembly earlier, but no action had followed. The controversy surfaced after allegations that the government-run school was charging students far more than the fee prescribed by the Education Department. Principal Sarabjit Singh had reportedly admitted to collecting additional charges with the approval of the School Management Committee (SMC), claiming the money was used to address staff shortages and support academic activities beyond the regular curriculum. The issue snowballed into a political controversy, with opposition leaders questioning the AAP government's flagship 'Sikhiya Kranti' initiative. Shiromani Akali Dal leader Sukhdeep Singh Sukkar and Jamhuri Adhikar Sabha activist Jasbir Deep alleged that the government could not claim to provide quality education at nominal cost while allowing a government school to charge fees beyond the notified rates. They also asked why the Punjab government's recently promulgated ordinance regulating fee and fund hikes in unaided private schools had not been enforced with similar rigour in Schools of Eminence. While private schools have been directed to submit records and refund excess fees, they alleged that no comparable action has been initiated against officials of the government-run school. The two leaders demanded that the government first refund the allegedly excess amount collected from parents at the School of Eminence and fix accountability before enforcing similar provisions against private schools. They also questioned the authority of the School Management Committee to alter the fee structure notified by the Education

‘Just keep him in jail for two days’: A day at Delhi’s first women police station



At 10 am on a humid July morning, a woman in a plain salwar-kameez walks hesitantly through the gates of a police station in North Delhi's Sabzi Mandi. Clutching a white polythene bag bulging with copies of identity documents, she heads towards the duty desk manned by Assistant Sub-Inspector (ASI) Meenu Bala. She identifies herself as 40-year-old Radhika. She tells Bala that she got married in 2016, but the relationship was turbulent from the start. Hoping things would improve, she endured years of domestic abuse. Now, with a child to care for, she says she no longer wants to suffer in silence. Bala nods, making notes on a complaint paper. Every now and then, she asks a question about the timeline of events. "This is the most important part of the job," she explains later. "The duty officer is the first person anyone meets when they enter a police station. That first interaction matters. If someone feels heard, half the hesitation disappears." The duty officer's desk sits immediately to the right, separated from complainants by a glass partition. A separate room is available for women who wish to speak in private. Barely a month after it opened on June 19, Delhi's first women police station has become the single point of contact for complaints ranging from domestic violence to sexual offences in the North district. Integrated with the Crime Against Women (CAW) Cell, it was set up to bring counselling and criminal investigation under one roof. At 57, Bala is from the 1994 batch of the Delhi Police. Before being posted here, she served as duty officer at Rani Bagh and Kamla Market police stations. Some narrate their complaints matter-of-factly. Some cry before they can complete the first sentence. Others spend several minutes simply gathering the courage to speak. For years, women approached different police stations in the North district and then their complaints were transferred to the CAW for counselling and mediation before criminal proceedings began, often requiring them to move between different offices and police units. Now, the counselling mechanism and the police station function as one unit, allowing complaints to move through a single system. Of these, 125 were received after the police station became operational. The remaining complaints came with the merger of the CAW Cell. Station House Officer Lakshmi Singh spends much of her day moving between investigation rooms, reviewing case files and speaking to officers. 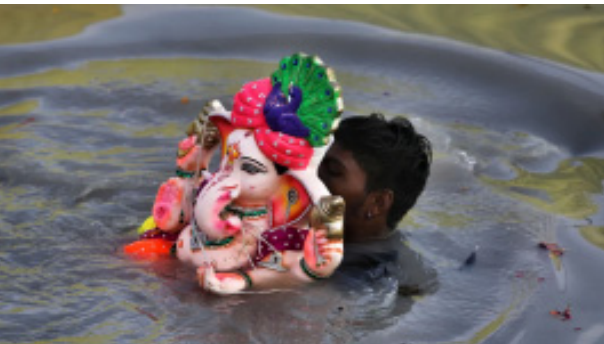

"Women often come to us and say, 'Bas unhe 48 ghante ke liye jail mein rakh dijiye. Sudhar jayege, (Just keep him in jail for two days. He'll change)'. The request is understandable, she says, but can't be executed. Many women are not necessarily looking for prolonged criminal proceedings, they just hope a brief spell in custody will act as a warning and save the marriage.

Since its inauguration, the station has registered nine FIRs, most of them transferred from other police stations: three relate to dowry harassment, two concern molestation, two involve rape/POCSO charges. Police officials say action has been initiated in all the cases, particularly those involving sexual offences.

Inside the station Unlike a conventional police station, where complainants often find themselves navigating multiple rooms before locating the right officer, this building has been designed around accessibility. The station opens into a large hall flooded with daylight. The duty officer's desk sits immediately to the right, separated from complainants by a glass partition. A separate room is available for women who wish to speak in private. The reception is in the centre. Behind it are the investigation officer's room, a conference room, the Station House Officer's office, a gym and women's barracks. A brightly painted children's room occupies one corner, a space for women who bring children along. While the duty officer records complaints and provides the first point of contact, investigation officers take over recording statements, examining evidence, counselling parties where required and initiating criminal proceedings wherever offences are made out.

Nearly 60 per cent of the personnel are women, while the remaining 40 per cent are men. In all, the station has around 57 women personnel, seven are Sub-Inspectors, thirteen are Assistant Sub-Inspectors. Officials say male officers continue to play an important operational role, particularly during night arrests, medical examinations, handling violent accused persons and situations where women accused are accompanied by aggressive male relatives. But staffing remains among the station's biggest challenges. Women Sub-Inspectors are required to investigate rape and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) cases. Yet several officers are currently unavailable because of maternity leave, medical leave or other reasons. Officials say only one officer is presently available full-time to handle such investigations. Infrastructure is another challenge. The reception area does not yet have air-conditioning. Because the structure is prefabricated, it heats up rapidly during summer, making conditions uncomfortable for both visitors and police personnel. These are teething troubles, officers say. The larger objective remains creating a police station where women feel comfortable enough to report crimes. Back at the duty officer's desk, Bala continues working through the day's complaints. Every few minutes, a complainant walks in. Some arrive alone, others come with parents or siblings

Ahead of Ganeshotsav, Maharashtra seeks HC nod for immersion of 6-ft-plus PoP idols in natural water bodies



The Maharashtra government on Wednesday defended its decision to continue allowing plaster of Paris (PoP) Ganesh idols taller than six feet to be immersed in natural water bodies, telling the Bombay High Court that the relaxation should continue until a viable solution is found for recycling the material. The state argued that the Central Pollution Control Board's (CPCB) 2020 guidelines on PoP idol immersion are advisory and not prohibitory, and opposed a public interest litigation seeking a complete ban on immersing large PoP idols in lakes, rivers and the sea.

If the court accepts the state's stand, large public Ganesh idols can continue to be immersed in natural water bodies this festival season, subject to the conditions laid down in the 2025 guidelines. According to the state's August 1, 2025 guidelines, idols exceeding six feet may be immersed in natural water bodies only where no alternative immersion facility is available. Such immersions

are subject to obtaining the necessary permissions, collecting the immersed material, scientifically disposing of it and cleaning the water body afterwards. In an affidavit filed before the court, Ramesh Mahale, Joint Secretary in the Environment Department, said the state was working towards finding a long-term solution for the reuse and recycling of PoP while continuing to promote eco-friendly Ganesh celebrations. The government said local authorities had created alternative immersion facilities for idols up to six feet in height and were taking steps to collect PoP waste after immersion while exploring recycling options. The PIL, filed after alleging poor implementation of the CPCB's 2020 guidelines, contends that allowing large PoP idols to be immersed in natural water bodies contributes to water pollution. Senior advocate Mihir Desai, appearing for the petitioners, argued that the state's revised guidelines were impractical and sought a complete prohibition on immersing PoP idols taller than six feet, which are commonly installed by Sarvajanik Ganesh mandals. The state, however, relied on a June 7, 2025 affidavit filed by the CPCB, which clarified that its 2020 guidelines govern only the immersion of PoP idols and are advisory in nature, not a prohibition on their manufacture or use. On that basis, it argued that the PIL was "misconceived". The government also told the court that the "internationally famous" Ganeshotsav forms part of Maharashtra's cultural heritage and said it remained equally committed to protecting the environment. It said awareness campaigns encouraging citizens to adopt eco-friendly idols had already led to a gradual shift away from PoP idols.

Stalker stabs schoolgirl to death near Kolkata after she rejected him

In a chilling incident near Kolkata, a 16-year-old schoolgirl was stabbed to death in Howrah, allegedly by a man who had been stalking her despite the teenager spurning his advances. The Class 10 student was followed and attacked while she was returning home on a bicycle around 7.00 pm on Wednesday. According to police and eyewitnesses, 24-year-old Samir Das stabbed her multiple times in the neck, hands, and stomach. "The girl was cycling back from her tuition class when the youth suddenly blocked her path. Before anyone could react, he pulled out a knife and began stabbing her indiscriminately. She collapsed on the road," said a police officer. Enraged bystanders overpowered the accused and thrashed him severely before handing him over to the nearest police station. The teenager was rushed to a private hospital and later shifted to the Howrah district hospital, where she succumbed to injuries late at night. Das, a resident of Murshidabad in north Bengal who works at a factory in Howrah, had been pursuing the 16-year-old for a long time, police have said. Preliminary interrogation reveals that the crime was a retaliatory act after the teenager repeatedly rejected his proposals. "We have taken the accused into custody, and a murder investigation is

underway," a senior police officer said. The attacker remains hospitalised under strict police watch. Three chilling crimes This comes after the gruesome gangrape and murder of an 11-year-old in Baruipur near Kolkata. Prabhash Mondol, an accused in the case, was killed in an encounter when he snatched a policeman's firearm during the reconstruction of the crime. The murder in Howrah also comes days after a woman was murdered in Sodepur in Bengal's North 24 Parganas district. Subhas Das murdered his estranged wife, Geeta Das, in broad daylight. After the attack, Subhas stabbed himself in a suicide attempt and suffered serious injuries. The back-to-back crimes against women have put the Suwendu Adhikari-led BJP government in a spot months after the party came to power after defeating the Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress in the state polls in May. Amid growing outrage over the crimes, Kolkata Police have rolled out a five-point Standard Operating Procedure to eliminate "administrative reluctance" and systemic delays in handling Zero FIRs. A Zero FIR is a case that can be filed at any police station in the country regardless of where the crime took place.

Koel Mallick gives up Trinamool's Rajya Sabha seat, meets BJP's Bhupender Yadav



In another blow to the Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress, actor Koel Mallick resigned as the party's Rajya Sabha MP on Thursday, just three months after the party nominated her to the Upper House of Parliament. Koel Mallick is Trinamool's fourth Rajya Sabha MP to quit amid the meltdown in the party in the aftermath of its defeat in the West Bengal Assembly polls in May. Sukhendu Sekhar Ray, Sushmita Dev and Prakash Chik Baraik, who resigned earlier, have joined the BJP. Hours later, the BJP nominated the trio for the election to the three seats they vacated.

Koel Mallick took the oath as a Rajya Sabha MP on April 6, but did not attend House proceedings at all. Mallick has submitted a resignation letter to the Rajya Sabha chairman and Vice President C P Radhakrishnan. In the letter, she has said she was resigning from the Rajya Sabha with immediate effect. "I convey my sincere gratitude to your Excellency, Hon'ble Deputy Chairman and all functionaries of the Rajya Sabha Secretariat extending all help and cooperation during my tenure as a Member of the Rajya Sabha," she added. Shortly after, she met Union Minister and BJP veteran Bhupender Yadav at his residence in Delhi, sparking a buzz about her next move. A popular face in the Bengali film industry, also known as Tollywood, Koel Mallick is the daughter of veteran Bengali film actor Ranjit Mallick and Deepa Mallick. She married film producer Nispal Singh in 2013, and they have a son. She has won several awards for her performances in movies. These include a Filmfare Awards Bangla, two Bengali Film Journalists' Association awards and an Anandalok Puraskar. In 2023, the West Bengal government, then under the Trinamool Congress, honoured her with the Mahanayak Samman.

Following her exit, the Trinamool Congress is left with nine MPs in the Rajya Sabha. The party is simultaneously fighting an exodus in the two Houses of Parliament, and the state Assembly. Twenty out of its 28 Lok Sabha MPs have switched to the lesser-known Nationalist Citizens Party of India and have said they back the NDA. The rebel MPs' bloc has also urged Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla to make separate seating arrangements for them. In the Assembly, a group of 60 MLAs from the Mamata Banerjee-led party has rebelled and claimed it is the real Trinamool Congress. The resignation of Koel Mallick is significant against the backdrop of the BJP's attempts to cobble together a two-third majority in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha before making another push for the Constitutional amendment Bill that provides for delimitation of parliamentary seats before implementing 33 per cent reservation for women in the Lok Sabha and state Assemblies. The government's earlier attempt to ensure the legislation clears Parliament failed in April.

Mumbai may get new long-distance rail terminus in Kandivali, if Defence clears land

In a bid to ease train congestion, the Western Railway has sought the Defence Ministry's land in Kandivali to develop a mega project for a long-distance terminus with nine platforms and a coaching depot, The Indian Express has learnt. But the project cannot proceed unless the Defence Ministry agrees to give away the land. In the past, the Defence Ministry has rejected two such requests by the Western Railway, on the grounds that the land was under "active occupation". Sources said the Western Railway expects to pursue Defence land through the appropriate channels. "The proposed site offers one of the few remaining large tracts of land capable of supporting a modern coaching terminal in Mumbai's suburban region. However, the project is entirely dependent on obtaining the required land," a source aware of the planning process said. Proposed features of Kandivali terminus, coaching depot

As per the preliminary discussion plans accessed by The Indian Express, the proposed infrastructure is planned on two parcels of defence land between Kandivali and Malad – also located close to the Kandivali car shed and Poisar Metro station, making them strategically placed for future multimodal connectivity. The larger land parcel, measuring approximately 1,100 metres by 400 metres, has been earmarked for the proposed coaching terminal. The Railways plans a full-fledged long-distance terminus with nine platforms, each around 625 metres in length, capable of handling 54 mail and express trains. The facility will also include six pit



lines for routine inspection and maintenance of coaches. It will also have nine stabling lines for parking and servicing rakes. Dedicated shunting tracks to facilitate train movements and two sick-line sheds where damaged or defective coaches can undergo repairs are also being planned. The second plot – measuring roughly 700 metres by 60 metres – has been identified for stabling lines and pit lines. If approved, the proposed long-distance terminus and coaching depot will augment terminal capacity in Mumbai. Currently, the existing long-distance stations, including Mumbai Central, Dadar, and Bandra Terminus, are operating near saturation. If implemented, the Kandivali terminus is expected to reduce pressure on the existing terminals in south Mumbai and substantially increase operational flexibility by allowing more trains to originate and terminate from the western suburbs.

Ajit Doval chairs 5th BIMSTEC Security Chiefs Meeting in New Delhi



New Delhi [India], National Security Advisor Ajit Doval on Thursday chaired the fifth BIMSTEC National Security Chiefs' meeting, hosting top-level intelligence and security officials from across the Bay of Bengal region to reinforce regional stability. The high-level gathering brought together delegates from the seven member nations of the Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC), which includes Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Thailand. The delegates gathered for a joint family photo, with discussions centring on counterterrorism, cybersecurity, and strengthening regional maritime cooperation. BIMSTEC Secretary General Indra Mani Pandey attended the meeting along with delegations from all member countries. Nepal was represented by Home Secretary Raj Kumar Shrestha. Thailand's delegation was led by Chatchai Bangchaud, Secretary General of the National Security Council. Bangchaud had also held bilateral talks with NSA Doval on Wednesday, focusing on enhanced intelligence sharing and law enforcement cooperation. Sri Lanka was represented by Air Vice Marshal Sampath Thuyacontha, Secretary at the Ministry of Defence. Bangladesh's delegation was led by Dr Shamsul Islam, Adviser to the Prime Minister of Bangladesh, and included Bangladesh High Commissioner to India M Riazul Hamidullah. Myanmar was represented by Tin Aung San, Minister in the President's Office. Bhutan's delegation comprised Home Secretary Sonam Wangyel and Bhutan's Ambassador to India, Major General Vetsop Namgyal. Hegseth said the screening programme is intended to ensure troops "have the right testosterone levels to operate at [their] absolute best because it's well-established science that as we age, testosterone levels often naturally drop."

Col Ebrahim Zolfaghari, a spokesperson for the Iranian military's Khatam Al-Anbiya Central Headquarters, issued the warning. Paresh Rawal claims OMG 2 was his idea: ‘Akshay Kumar took the script, didn’t give me credit’



When OMG 2 was gearing up for release in 2023, it ran into trouble with the Central Board of Film Certification (CBFC) over its blend of sex education and religious themes. After multiple delays, the film was eventually cleared with an A certificate, even though the makers had hoped for a U/A rating as they intended to target adolescents. Several modifications were also made, including changing Akshay Kumar’s character from Lord Shiva to ‘Shiv Ka Doot’. However, according to Paresh Rawal, much of the controversy could have been avoided had the makers stuck to his original story, which, he claims, centred on the relationship between a father and son and did not involve any divine intervention.

Speaking to Vickey Lalwani, the veteran actor claimed he had conceived the original story for what later became OMG 2 and shared the idea with director Amit Rai, with whom he developed the screenplay. According to him, the project took a different turn after Akshay Kumar came on board. ‘The story was never meant to have God’ Recalling how the project began, Paresh said, ‘I had approached Amit Rai, the director of Road to Sangam, and asked him if he was planning another film. I admire him a lot. I told him, ‘I have an idea. Let’s sit and write it.’ I told him I wasn’t a writer but I could contribute ideas and help identify where we were going wrong because I understand screenplay to some extent.” He continued, “The story was about a boy who gets caught masturbating, and a video of the incident goes viral, making his life miserable. His father was a tourist guide at the Khajuraho temple. Amit suggested making him a part-time priest at the Mahakal Temple. We developed the script together and even brought sexologist Dr Prakash Kothari on board. We had several meetings because our intention was to make the film educational, entertaining and not vulgar. We were deeply involved in the process.” Rawal said the

script was later narrated to filmmaker Anurag Kashyap and subsequently to Somen Mishra from Karan Johar’s Dharma Productions. “Somen outright said it wouldn’t work,” he recalled. ‘We didn’t need God in the story’

Rawal further revealed that the original concept was vastly different from the final film. “Our main idea was to have a biker guiding the father, not God. In the first OMG, God appeared because the case was against God. But this film was about a father’s fight to get justice for his son. There was no need for a divine character. We wanted someone like Kader Khan’s character in Muqaddar Ka Sikandar.” According to Rawal, he approached Ajay Devgn and Salman Khan for the role of the biker. “I didn’t approach Akshay because people would have assumed it was OMG 2, whereas that wasn’t the plan.” Paresh alleged that the project changed course after Akshay Kumar expressed interest in it. “I was under the impression that we were still figuring things out. We even had a meeting with Vipul Shah of Optimystix. They also asked about Akshay, and I said if I wanted to make it with him, I would have approached him directly. Akshay and I were partners in OMG. I didn’t need anyone to bridge the gap.” He added, “A few days later, Amit Rai called and told me Akshay wanted to do the film. The issue was that Amit had tentatively written ‘OMG 2’ on the script because the genre was similar.” Rawal believes the script reached Akshay through producer Ashwin Varde. “In one of our meetings, Ashwin Varde was present. That’s when they decided they wanted to do it with Akshay.” He continued, “I told Amit that I didn’t want to go ahead with it. Amit said, ‘But they want to make it.’ They took the script from him. I told Amit I couldn’t fight him; he’s my friend. If that’s what he had chosen, I wished him well. I repeatedly told them not to make it a franchise because it wasn’t one. But they still went ahead.” The veteran actor said Akshay Kumar later personally asked him to be a part of the film. “I spoke to Akshay. He asked me to do the film. I told him, ‘No. This isn’t the film I had envisioned. There is no role of God in this story.’ He tried to convince me, but I had lived with the script from the beginning. I knew exactly what it was supposed to be. That’s why I walked away.” The role eventually went to Pankaj Tripathi. Rawal also claimed he did not receive credit for the story. “The saddest part is that I wasn’t even given credit for the story or the concept. My name wasn’t mentioned anywhere.” He further claimed that everyone he had narrated the script to was aware that the idea originated with him. “Amit, Akshay, Ashwin, Ajay Devgn, Karan Johar and Salman Khan... all know it was my idea and my story. Ajay and Salman probably said no because of the subject. They thought it could become controversial. I tried explaining the concept to them.”

‘Amitabh Bachchan ko noch dala’: Paresh Rawal says Big B was persecuted, he only wants peace



Paresh Rawal is known not just for his acting prowess but also for speaking his mind. Never one to shy away from expressing his opinions, the actor recently weighed in on the buzz surrounding Amitabh Bachchan’s cryptic X post, in which the veteran star wrote, “Wanted to say something, but thought – NO!! Don’t say it.” Reacting to the post, Paresh said he believes fear is what is stopping Amitabh Bachchan from speaking his mind. Speaking to Vickey Lalwani, Rawal said: “People are afraid. They fear harassment from those in authority. Earlier, some people spoke unapologetically. If you notice, the number of such people has also reduced over time.” He then reflected on Bachchan’s own political experience. “What will he do at this age? He has seen how people tore him apart after the VP Singh episode. If power comes after you, it can ruin your life. We don’t know everything he went through. He suffered a lot. Amitabh is not someone who believes in conflict. He prefers peace. He folds his hands and ends the argument there itself. Many mistake that for weakness. He doesn’t like fights, toxicity or negativity around him.” Talking in the same interview, Paresh Rawal also recalled the time he almost starred alongside Amitabh Bachchan in 102 Not Out, only to be dropped from the film at the last minute. Speaking to Vickey Lalwani, Rawal said, “Politics never really played a role in the reduced number of films I did. The number reduced because I refused to do them. I am using the word ‘refuse’ and not ‘reject’. Many times, I simply didn’t find merit in the scripts or the stories.” He added, “Even while being a politician, I had enough time to do films. Parliament functions for around 110 days a year. I still had about 265 days to myself. I had even reduced my theatre shows.”

After her eviction, Madhuri sat down for a special conversation with actress Tejasswi Prakash, where she addressed her remark that “if poor people have more kids, poverty will increase.” Madhuri also got emotional and pledged to give Rs 1 crore to someone who went to jail because of her personal battles.

Madhuri Grover revisits her ‘rich vs poor’ childbirth logic On the first judgement day of the season, Madhuri Jain Grover shared a secret from her life. She said that she wanted to plan a third child with Ashneer Grover. However since their families opposed the decision, they didn’t go ahead with that decision. During that discussion, Madhuri went on to say that she believed that if the rich had more children, they would contribute more to the country’s economy. She said, “We wanted to have a third child, but we got influenced by our family’s circumstances. Despite being educated and having so much, we were not able to make that decision. We got influenced by Ashneer’s mom’s idea that two kids are enough, and later, when we wanted a third child, it was too late. We have that regret. All the rich people have a third child, and he makes you feel young. If the rich people have more kids, wealth will increase, and if poor people have more kids, poverty will increase.”

Now, in a special curated interview segment called Shut up with Tejasswi, hosted actress Tejasswi Prakash. Madhuri revisited her controversial statement. She said, “I never stopped anyone from having kids. The problem with this generation is that people don’t want to have kids. I said, ‘If the rich give birth to more kids, the country will get richer; if the poor give birth to more kids, poverty will increase.’ We resonated with that.” When Tejasswi pointed out how her remark came across as ‘insensitive’ on social media, Madhuri added, “The wealthy people are only running the country; others are getting employment through the rich.” Tejasswi disagreed and said, “Poor people are also running the country, ma’am.” Responding to this, Madhuri added, “While the poor also drive the nation, not all of them are doing so. You seriously think the poor are running the country? I never stopped anyone from having kids. On social media, people like to pity themselves. Humein gareeb bold diya. If they consider themselves poor, then they will stay poor.” While Lock Upp Sach Ya Sazaa is said to be a journey of redemption for its contestants, an emotional Madhuri Jain Grover said her journey is not yet complete. Soon after her eviction, Madhuri teared up and told Tejasswi Prakash, “While I am still in the Lock Upp area, there are a few things I couldn’t say. I was in London when the show was offered to me. It was not easy for me to say yes to it. My inner voice told me that this was a chance for redemption. I wanted to give the winning amount to that one special person who had to face Lock Upp in real life due to my personal battles. I unfortunately could not win the show, but I will still give Rs 1 crore to that person; only then will my journey of redemption be over.”

In an exclusive interview with SCREEN, Madhuri Jain Grover also revealed that a lot of her fellow contestants

‘Someone refused to work with me’ Rawal then recalled how he unexpectedly exited 102 Not Out. “In 102 Not Out, I was supposed to play the role that Rishi Kapoor eventually did. I was associated with the project for two to three years. Then suddenly, I was out. I asked Umesh what happened, and he told me someone had refused to work with me. He never named that person. I still don’t know exactly why I was removed, but I can tell you it had nothing to do with my political stint.” When asked whether he tried to find out who had objected, Rawal replied, “I didn’t pursue it because Umesh is a friend. I asked him once, understood that there were issues, and didn’t want to embarrass him. I could have dug out the truth. I was the victim in that situation. I know who wanted me out, but I don’t want to say it publicly. I even confronted that person, but they denied knowing anything about it. I let it go. Whenever I have a problem with someone, I prefer calling them directly instead of speculating.” At the peak of his acting career, Amitabh Bachchan entered politics in 1984 at the request of his close friend, then Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi. Contesting on a Congress ticket, he won the Allahabad Lok Sabha seat by defeating veteran politician Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna by a massive margin. Around the same time, Vishwanath Pratap (VP) Singh became Finance Minister in the Rajiv Gandhi government. During his tenure, he launched a high-profile crackdown on tax evasion and expanded investigations by the Enforcement Directorate into suspected violations of foreign exchange laws. Given Amitabh Bachchan’s close friendship with the Gandhi family, media attention also turned towards the Bachchan family during this period. Allegations surfaced regarding possible foreign exchange violations, although no charges were ultimately proven against the actor. The controversy intensified after the Bofors scandal broke in 1987. Around the same period, a Swedish newspaper alleged that Amitabh Bachchan and his brother Ajitabh Bachchan held secret Swiss bank accounts linked to alleged kickbacks in the Bofors deal. The Bachchan brothers consistently denied the allegations.

VP Singh later resigned from the Congress government, alleging corruption in the Bofors deal and emerging as Rajiv Gandhi’s principal political rival. Amitabh Bachchan’s name frequently surfaced in the political discourse surrounding the controversy, despite his repeated denials. Facing mounting political scrutiny and media attention, Bachchan resigned from Parliament in 1987 and announced his exit from politics. However, the scrutiny didn’t end. In 1988, VP Singh formed the Janata Dal and went on to win the Allahabad by-election from the seat vacated by Bachchan, cementing his position as the face of the anti-Congress movement. After becoming Prime Minister in 1989, Singh’s government continued investigations into the Bofors affair and related financial matters. Amitabh and Ajitabh Bachchan remained under scrutiny for years in connection with Foreign Exchange Regulation Act (FERA) and tax-related investigations. However, they consistently denied any wrongdoing, and over time, the allegations against them were not substantiated. Various investigations and court proceedings ultimately did not establish their involvement in the alleged kickback scandal. In 2012, the actor was officially cleared of involvement in the scandal.
